

Miami developer to turn ex-health center into retail, offices

A foreclosure case against nonprofit Helen B. Bentley Family Health Center was resolved through the \$5.7 million sale of its former Miami headquarters to a developer who has plans for a retail and office complex.



The nonprofit had been sued by Bayview Loan Services over a \$3.3 million mortgage before last week's sale of the 3090 South Douglas Road site to Miami-based Treo Douglas Station. The buyers plan to redevelop the 1.2 acres into a commercial site. Treo could also include residential units.
